**Orientation Programme for Parents**

**Academics**

Examinations

- ❖ Students shall appear for two rounds of unit test in the first term followed by SA1. In the second term, there is another round of UT followed by two Pre-Board Exams.
- ❖ The question paper for the SA1 and Pre-Boards will be set according to the CBSE pattern.
- ❖ Practical exams will be conducted twice during the year (during SA1 & Pre-Board).
- ❖ Examination schedule is given in the school diary.
- ❖ Students representing school for any competition on the day of UT/SA will have to appear for a retest.
- ❖ Tentative completion of syllabus - third week of November.
- ❖ Board Practicals will be from Jan 15<sup>th</sup> 2018 to Feb 15<sup>th</sup> 2018.

Co-scholastic grades, Project and Practical Work

- ❖ Students are graded on co-scholastic areas (G.St. W.Exp, P.E) on nine-point scale, based on their school performance in these areas.
- ❖ A candidate who has some physical deformity or is otherwise unable to take part in Work Experience and Physical and Health Education, may be granted exemption by the CBSE on the recommendation of the Head of the Institution, supported by the medical certificate from a Medical Officer of the rank not below an Assistant Surgeon of a hospital approved by CBSE.
- ❖ Students have to strictly comply with the deadlines and instructions given by the subject teacher for completion of their project and practical work in their respective subjects.
- ❖ It is necessary to score 33% both in theory and practicals. Failure in either component will result in overall 'Fail'.

Practical marks: History, Accounts, and B.St – 20 marks each

Psychology, Multimedia, Computer Science, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, P.E , Geography –30 marks each

Painting – 60 marks

Sixth subject

- ❖ Students planning to give the Board Exam in their sixth subject must appear for all the UTs and the SA paper.
- ❖ They also have to complete their practical files if any.
- ❖ In case a student is not appearing for the sixth subject, an application stating the same should be given to the class teacher for school records, right at the beginning of the session.

CBSE provisions for students of special needs

- ❖ If the student is Dyslexic/learning disability he will be considered under “Special category” which entitles her/him for extra time in the Board exam.
- ❖ CBSE also allows a “scribe” for such students on submission of an application (by September). The application has to be sent to CBSE for approval.

Remedial Classes

Remedial classes (Timings: 2.15p.m - 3.45p.m.) will be organized for all students who need special attention. The schedule for the same will be uploaded in the school website. **Attendance is mandatory.** Students can avail the school transport after remedial.

**Developing study skills and habit**

- Follow a regular time schedule for study. Make a strict realistic timetable accommodating all subjects and follow it religiously.
- Do a daily review of topics taught in the classes and a cumulative review on weekends.
- Balance co-curricular and academics/school work and coaching classes

- Ways to remember: Make quick notes. Stick them on to the same page/unit. Make full use of the study material provided by school.
- Practice numerical, derivations etc.,
- Be familiar with CBSE paper, blueprint and marking scheme of each subject.
- Develop speed in writing by attempting a 3-hour paper. (Practice sample papers given school study material)

### **Applying to Foreign Universities**

Documents like Letter of Recommendations from teachers, transcripts of Class IX, X, XI, predicted scores are needed while applying to foreign/Indian Universities. An application for the same, addressed to Principal needs to be given, with details of documents required, 2 weeks ahead for school to process the documents.

### **Career counseling sessions**

School conducts many career counseling sessions for students to help them make right decision in choosing their careers. Parents will also be called to interact with the career counselors.

### **Our expectation from students**

- Be regular to school. As per the CBSE norms 75% attendance is mandatory for a child to be allowed to appear for the board examinations.(Refer school diary pg no.)(Parents to take prior permission from the Principal for planned leave &Medical certificate if absent for more than 3 days)
- Be attentive in your class. If you are regular and attentive, half the battle is won!
- Be well groomed at all times.(Refer school almanac.)
- Compensate for the missed lessons/concepts on the very next day (interschool fests, illness etc.)
- Carry the school almanac daily.
- Do not bring any electronic gadgets to school especially mobiles.
- Be punctual to school and do not reach school by self-driven vehicle except cycle.
- Attempt all tests with sincerity. Do not have the fear of failure. Remember failures are stepping-stone to success.

### **Our expectation from Parents**

- To be regular in attending all PTM's.
- To take utmost care in sending personal data as and when demanded by the CBSE and also report to school whenever called for CBSE verification.
- To report any form of medical condition of the student (Allergy/ Dyslexia or any physical ailment)to the CT with proper documents to ensure that proper care is given at all times.
- Keep the doors of communication always open. **Update your address/Phone nos./e-mail ids with the school immediately in case of any change.**
- Discuss your ward's difficulties/academic performance after taking a prior appointment with the concerned teacher.
- Check mails from school on a daily basis. Also check the school website for regular updates related to school. Refer to [www.cbse.nic.in](http://www.cbse.nic.in) for cbse updates.
- Be sensitive about whom your children are mixing up with.
- Encourage them to read everyday for 30 minutes (newspaper, a book)
- Avoid combining extra leave with the regular holidays/vacation.
- Supervising time spent by your ward on social networking sites on a daily basis.
- Check whether your ward is well groomed before he/she leaves to school.
- To ensure your ward does not carry any electronic gadgets to school. If found it will be confiscated.(Refer to almanac)
- If you find any behavioral changes of concern in your ward,do not neglect. Kindly talk to our counselor at the earliest.

Please remember we are all in it together. As a parent, you have to walk shoulder to shoulder with your child. Parents should be guides and motivators, not overpowering and demanding.
