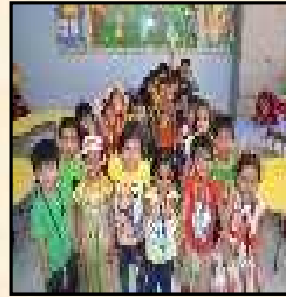

## PRE-PRIMARY SCHOOL
